5/9	 Workshop Debrief: Incorporating Culturally Affirming Curriculum (Zoom) 4 – 5:30 PM Select pairs will present mini lessons that complement the April workshop. Discussion of these lessons and classroom application will follow.
MAY & JUNE	Residency Planning and Implementation Teaching artists and school educators will be partnered to implement a 3-day residency within the school educator's district. Arts Professional Learning Institute (APLI) 2023 - 2024 Deadline: Monday, November 27, 2023 | 5:00 PM

The Arts Professional Learning Institute (APLI) is a co-sponsored project of <u>Young Audiences Arts for Learning NJ</u> <u>& Eastern PA</u> and the <u>New Jersey State</u> <u>Council on the Arts</u>, a partner agency of the <u>National Endowment for the Arts</u>. It is generously supported by the <u>Grunin Foundation</u>, and the <u>Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation</u>.

APLI's mission is to provide professional learning opportunities to New Jersey's teaching artists, classroom teachers, and school administrators. APLI aims to engage the arts educator in inclusive, progressive, arts-based professional learning experiences so that the whole student can be reached, inclusive of race, ethnicity, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, and ability.

APLI will present participants with both in-person and virtual professional learning workshops and workshop debriefs. If there are changes to state/federal health guidelines, planned in-person workshops will be held virtually.

In addition, APLI will pair teaching artists and school educators to implement 3-day mini residencies in a classroom setting.

Participants for the 2023 – 2024 cohort will be chosen to represent diverse art forms, experience levels, and geographic reach in the state. Priority will be given to new applicants, however former cohort members are welcome to apply.

Cohort members will receive a stipend for participation. More information about the stipend can be found under "Commitment & Application."

Eligibility

Arts educators who live and/or work in the state of NJ are eligible to apply for the Arts Professional Learning Institute (APLI). Eligible candidates can have a variety of experiences in arts education – beginner through expert. Applicants should have a willingness to learn, grow, and reflect. The design of the program relies on participants to be active collaborators who aim to grow their understanding of inclusive and progressive arts education and who are actively working to help design the program for future cohort members.

APLI welcomes candidates of all art forms (visual, performing, literary, media arts) and backgrounds (race, religion, national origin, gender, age, disability, gender identity and gender expression, sexual orientation, or veteran status).

Applicants can apply as a teaching artist or school educator. A school educator is defined as an arts specialist (classroom music teachers, visual arts teachers, drama teachers, etc.), classroom educator, inclusion and special education teacher, or school/department administrator. Applicants who have an existing relationship with a teaching artist/school are encouraged to apply as a two-person team.

Applicants should have at least 1 – 5 years of experience in the field of education or arts education. Priority will be placed on new applicants, however former APLI cohort members are welcome to apply.

Teaching artists are required to have updated background checks prior to participating in the mini-residency.

Commitment & Application

Participants for the 2023 – 2024 cohort will be chosen to represent diverse art forms, experience levels, and geographic reach in the state.

APLI cohort members will receive a paid stipend (\$1100 for classroom educators, \$3465 for teaching artists) that covers the time for all program components and participation in program evaluation. Additional stipend for travel will be included, pending inperson events.

The stipend will be paid in three (3) installments upon completion and participation in the program's events. If an APLI cohort member withdraws from the program, or if attendance and participation in program events declines, the payments will be subject to proration or termination.

Applicants will receive email confirmation within two (2) business days to confirm receipt of your application. Applicants will be notified of the results on or before December 11, 2023.
